- > Four-courses over three quarters
- > In-person, evening courses on the UW Seattle campus
- > Tuition for the 2020-2021 academic year \$860 per credit
- > Part-time program, not eligible for financial aid

UCD STRUCTURE

- > Graduate level certificate that can be earned in nine months
- September 30, 2020 start date
 Orientation on September 22nd at 6pm
- > Courses shared with Master's students
- Transferrable credit to the Master of Science in Human Centered Design & Engineering degree

ADMISSIONS

Admission Requirements

- Bachelor's degree from a four-year, accredited institution
- Minimum of two years of work experience in a related field
- Submit Online Application, supplemental materials and application fee by June 2, 2020
- Application available May 1, 2020: https://www.pce.uw.edu/certificates/user-centered-design

ADMISSIONS

Deadline: June 2, 2020

Application Materials:

- Application form located on PCE website
- Resume
- Unofficial or official transcripts (must show degree earned)
- A typed response (500-word max) to these prompts:
 - How have your prior experiences (in or outside the workplace) prepared you for this program and the UX field?
 - How will the Certificate in User-Centered Design help you reach your longerterm goals?
- TOEFL scores (if applicable) *
- \$50 fee

ADMISSIONS

If admitted, new students will be advised to enroll in the certificate program as a Graduate Non-Matriculated (GNM) student.

If a student enrolls in the UCD certificate as a GNM student, 12 credits can transfer to the MS program (HCDE 518, 517, and Design Elective).

Per Graduate School policy, only 12 credits of GNM coursework can transfer to a graduate degree.
